





The different elements of the Reach Curriculum are tied together through a theme based approach whereby the various domains of curriculum are integrated through a theme. Each Reach classroom enhances students' learning through well-equipped Learning Centres which offer a rich variety of spaces, materials and activities especially organised to promote active exploration and mastery. The three year Reach Programme aims at providing high quality, developmentally appropriate education. It strives to develop independent thinkers and lifelong learners equipped with the skill set crucial to their success in the coming years.



LACAS INTEGRATION OF TECHNOLOGY IN EDUCATION (LITE)

Technology is an integral part of the life of every 21st century child. To cater to the differing learning styles and abilities of our students, the organization aspires to use technology across the curriculum to provide global learning experiences that extend beyond the walls of the classroom. We aim to produce technologically skilled lifelong learners who are prepared to successfully thrive in today's highly competitive, global society. The staff are empowered to make informed decisions, with state-of-the-art resources and equipment, so that students' potential is capitalized effectively through the meaningful integration of modern technologies.



ACADEMIC YEAR

The academic year at LACAS is divided into two terms. Students are assessed on a regular basis. This includes continuous assessments and examinations. Continuous assessments are based on class assignments, projects, quizzes and presentations during the course of the year. Examinations are conducted at the end of each academic term.

DEPARTMENT OF ACADEMICS AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The academic department designs the scheme of studies along with its resource for all the campuses of LACAS and ensures its complete implementation as per the set learning objectives and criteria.

The department ensures healthy teaching practices across all grades and subjects through extensive incorporation of activity and inquiry based approaches. The 'Khel Khel Mein', 'Writer's Retreat' and 'Explore the World' sections in the Urdu, English and Social Studies scheme of studies explicitly enable students to relate their classroom learning to real life situations making education fun through experiential learning.

"The English Language Buddies" have been introduced in each branch. These language buddies work together with their coteachers on crafting effective lesson plans with special emphasis on language proficiency and their optimal execution in the classes.

Academic Facilitators observe classes and guide faculty members on the latest teaching practices. They are available full-time in each branch and provide support wherever required including (and not limited to) provision of resource material, taking demonstration classes, assisting with lesson plans and suggesting different activities that can enhance learning within the classrooms.

The academic and teacher training department helps to realize the school's vision of a strong enquiry based curricula taught by an experienced, trained and motivated faculty. It instills in both the students and the faculty a deep-rooted passion for the acquisition of knowledge that ensures lifelong learning.

O LEVEL AND A LEVEL

Upon successful completion of Grade VIII, students will transfer to the O Level Programme. Parents and students are given all necessary guidance to help them make an informed decision about O Level subject options at this critical stage of the students' academic career.

The students take Cambridge International Examinations for two compulsory subjects (Pakistan Studies and Islamiyat) at the end of Grade X.

Admission to A Level is determined on individual merit, the criteria being the applicants' O Level result, past academic performance and previous disciplinary record. All applicants are interviewed by the admission panel. The A Level programme at LACAS offers a wide variety of subjects which enable our students to enter top national and international universities.



ACADEMIC/ CO-CURRICULAR SCHOLARSHIPS



LACAS has a scholarship programme at A Level that honours academic as well as co-curricular achievements. All scholarships are reviewed twice a year. Students must maintain 85% attendance and requisite grades in all subjects for merit scholarships to continue.

Limited scholarships are awarded for sports and co-curricular activities. The recipients are expected to maintain at least 85% attendance and to actively represent LACAS at inter-school competitions and contests.





The Programme boasts of a panel of world class coaches tutoring a collective camp of students from all campuses. Thorough practice sessions, participation in the best national and international tournaments along with awards and recognition are its hallmark. Furthermore, academic support, student council positions and a well established system of scholarships are its key features.

SONDHI Debates

The Sondhis are Pakistan's most prestigious and oldest World Schools Debating Championships. We pride ourselves on providing students with innovative opportunities to engage with debates, whether it be students speaking against their coaches, against university level teams or against international teams. In this tradition, we have, for the past 3 years, sent a Team Sondhi, comprising of the best speakers from the tournament to an international tournament of repute. In 2014-15 we attended the EurOpen, winning the championship. In 2015-16 we attended the Eurasian Schools Debating Championship, ranking 3rd in the preliminaries. In 2016-17 we attended the Asian World Schools Debating Championship, ranking 3rd in the preliminaries and losing to the eventual champions, Peru, in the Octo-Finals.



COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAMME

It is our belief at LACAS that part of a "complete" education is to instill in the students a sense of responsibility towards society; one in which they are lucky to be among the privileged few. To this end LACASians students regularly organize fund raising events for several charities including CARE. Shaukat Khanum Memorial Trust Hospital, Fatima Jinnah Memorial Trust Hospital, The Citizens Foundation, PSRD and Afiat Old People's Home to name a few. LACAS also actively works on social work projects that it adopts from time to time. Some of the major social work campaigns undertaken by LACAS include relief effort for the earthquake victims of Pakistan and the construction of five hundred shelters in 2005; relief for the Balochistan Flood victims in 2007; relief effort for the Pakistan flood affectees in 2010 that included rehabilitation and the reconstruction of three villages in Charsadda, Khyber Pakhthoonkhawa, where a total of ninety three houses were constructed by LACAS. We have also adopted a school for less privileged children in Barkatpura village. Since 2013, we have been in liaison with Sundas Foundation to help thalassemia patients.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

While rules and regulations are necessary, it is our expectation that each student will himself/herself come to realize the value of self-discipline. Admission at LACAS implies agreement on the part of students to accept and willingly observe reasonable standards of accountability, appearance and good conduct.

ATTENDANCE

- Written applications must be brought for all absences; approved absences will not be fined.
- Sick leave applications exceeding two days must be supported by medical certificates. Late arrivals will be sent back.

UNIFORM / GROOMING

It is mandatory for all students to adhere to the grooming and uniform regulations at all times.

CONDUCT


Any student found guilty of indiscipline, misconduct / misbehavior or found disturbing the atmosphere and smooth running of the institution shall be liable for disciplinary action.

ACADEMIC DISCIPLINE

It is mandatory for students to maintain at least 85% attendance and sit for all informed tests / examinations in order to be promoted to the next class and / or to be registered for O and A Level Examinations.

FEE POLICY

- All charges except security deposit are non-refundable.
- Fee is charged on a bi-monthly basis.
- Fee bills are issued 10 days prior to the due date.
- There are fines for late payment of dues.
- Students with outstanding dues will not be allowed to attend classes or sit for examinations.
- Security must be collected within 6(six) months of leaving school.
- One month notice is required for withdrawal, failing which School Leaving Certificate / Reports may be withheld by school authorities.
- The management reserves the right to revise the fee structure and school rules and regulations as and when required.
- The fees and other charges are subject to annual increase.
